Missing Individuals

Has a child or a relative disappeared from the records? You aren't finding them in the birth, marriage or death records? Aside from inefficient priests who didn't record every record they should have, don't forget to search the passport records.

In extracting these records, unaccompanied children as young as 12 years old are found to be traveling to Brazil or America.

Once you get the hang of reading them, they become very easy to search!

Some years are missing.

- The index for *Misericórdia das Velas* by Frederico Maciel has been completed. It is arranged alphabetically by first name. This is the first of numerous published books we are working to index. See below for details on how you can help!
- SJMD (São Jorge Marriage Dispensations). After over a year of work, we are proud to announce that completed transcripts were published on April 1st. The book is available for download on our website as an eBook (\$5.50) or as a bound paperback volume on Amazon (\$10). A huge shout out to Joao Ventura for all of his hard work in extracting the records. The dispensations start in 1683 and are complete through 1830. Jeremy will be adding research tips on how to use this marvelous resource. Don't miss it.
